Resolutions

Have you made any New Year's resolutions? With the coming of a new calendar year, people often take the time to reflect on changes they feel they need to make in their lives. The top ten resolutions a couple of years ago, according to the *Journal of Clinical Psychology*, were:

- 1. Lose weight
- 2. Get organized
- 3. Spend less, save more
- 4. Enjoy life to the fullest
- 5. Stay fit and healthy
- 6. Learn something exciting
- 7. Quit smoking
- 8. Help others in their dreams
- 9. Fall in love
- 10. Spend more time with family

Personally, I found number 9 a bit odd; how does one make good on a resolution to fall in love? Whatever. I'm sure you'll agree that all these items are good things... IF people actually did them. Writing for *Women's Health,* on-line author Corrie Paul says that only about 40 percent of us are still holding onto our resolutions by July. Frankly, I didn't think the statistics were that high or that resolutions lasted that long.

I know that dedicated "gym rats" hate the month of January because their fitness centers and health clubs become overrun by people who have resolved to lose weight and/or get in shape. They tolerate the long waits for their favorite exercise machines, patiently enduring until February when the resolutions evaporate and the couch potatoes go away. We can be thankful that our Lord did not allow his resolution to fade away. To the contrary, he set an example of resolve for us. "When the days drew near for (Jesus) to be taken up," St. Luke wrote, "he set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). Other translations say that "he was determined to go to Jerusalem," that "he steadfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem," or that "he resolutely set out for Jerusalem" (emphasis added). These are all variations on the Greek word, sterizo, which means "to make fast" or "establish." It's a word that denotes power and strength, expressing assurance that Jesus would not shrink from the challenges that he faced.

Although he knew what terrible things awaited him – betrayal, false arrest, scourging, denial and, finally, crucifixion – he would not be dissuaded. Nothing could thwart his resolution to defeat sin, death and the power of the grave. And we are the beneficiaries of his resolve.

As we look back to Christmas and remember God's great gift to us in the birth of his Son, we can also look forward to Easter when the full import of that gift is realized. As we celebrate Epiphany with the arrival of the Magi and their worship of the infant King of kings, we can rejoice that the tiny baby of Bethlehem would trade his manger bed for a rough-hewn cross where the problem of sin would be resolved once and for all.

Entering this New Year of Our Lord, 2019, I pray that each of us would resolve to "run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 1:1b-2).
