Moving Forward by Faith

We must also pay attention to our financial needs for the coming year. With the success of last year's pledge campaign, we will soon be in the midst of another one for 2019. Thank you all for your faithfulness in this area. Due to your generous and faithful giving, as well as wise stewardship on the part of our congregational officers and ministry leaders, we will end the 2018 fiscal year with a budget surplus.

While, as the ads for investment opportunities say, "records of past performance are not indicators of future success," I believe we have seen the wisdom of preparing a budget based on financial pledging. So, allow me to introduce our 2019 pledge campaign, *Moving Forward by Faith*.

God has blessed us abundantly this year as he has demonstrated again and again his faithfulness. It is truly a blessing to be part of God's family here are First Lutheran Church.

Hebrews 11:6 says, "And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him." Faith is simply taking God at his word. Faith is not believing that God can, but that God will. As one author wrote, "Faith sees the invisible, believes the incredible, and receives the impossible."

When we take God at his word, whether as an individual, a family, or as a church, we move forward by faith. We step out in obedience as God directs. Nowhere is that more evident than in our giving. Even from a human perspective, it doesn't make sense. Even when from an accounting perspective, the numbers do not add up. As one person said it so well, "God does not ask for our endorsement of his plan, just our obedience to it."

And that takes faith. It takes being willing to take the first step when we cannot see the second step clearly or at all. It takes "moving forward by faith"

one step at a time. It takes trusting God to keep his promises to provide all that is needed. Do **you** believe God exists? Do **you** believe that God rewards those who earnestly seek him? Do **you** believe that God will keep his promises to **you**?

If so, will you be a part of those who are "moving forward by faith"? Will you covenant with God, by faith, to give in 2019 as he provides, even if you do not know where the funds will come from? Please take a few moments to read to the end of this letter, then ask God to give you specific direction concerning what you should give in 2019. Finally, please complete the pledge card that is included with this issue of *The Torch* and bring it with you on "Harvest Celebration Sunday," November 18, 2018.

Remember that your pledge is a commitment you make not to the church or to any committee. It is to God. As you complete the pledge card, you are saying, in effect, is: "Lord, as you provide, by faith, this is how I intend to give in the future." The Advent season is fast upon us, as we prepare to celebrate the coming of the Christ Child nearly two millennia ago. The theme for this year's observance is "Your King Is Coming," a series of three devotional sermons based on the unlikely kingship of Jesus. When we think of a kingdom, we may envision regal ceremonies wrapped in great pomp and circumstance. The king may be approached only by the most highly regarded of his subjects; the upright, the innocent, the exalted. But that's not the King we celebrate. Jesus is the king of shame, the king of guilt, and the king of the low.

Unlike previous years, there will be no evening services for Advent. Instead, we will meet at 11:30 AM in the church fellowship hall (a.k.a. the basement] for a devotional service based on the *Lutheran Service Book's Service of Prayer and Preaching*. A potluck lunch and a time of fellowship will follow. The Ministry of Elders made this change in order to make these services more attractive to our members who do not like to drive at night.

Christmas Eve this year will be a bit more traditional with two traditional evening worship services. Each service will follow Lessons and Carols format for the beginning and conclude with the celebration of the Lord's Supper and the singing of *Silent Night* by candlelight.

Decorating for Christmas

Under the leadership of the Elders – well, make that the Elders' wives – we will decorate the chancel and sanctuary for the Christmas season after the worship service on Sunday, November 25. The outdoor manger scene will also be set up. Many hands make for light work, so please plan to stay and help if at all possible.

Music Program

Due the resignation of Dale Kettering as our Music Ministry Director we've had to make some temporary changes in our music program. Until further notice there will be no adult choir, unless some talented member of our congregation wants to step forward to lead that effort. This precisely what has happened with JuBELLation, our bell choir, where a group of members has organized a self-led bell choir to enhance our worship music. for leading this effort. They will meet on Wednesday's at 1:00 PM in the upper meeting room with the goal of performing once a month.

Liz Riley will continue to support our Sunday worship services on piano until such time that the Ministry of Elders can identity and hire a new Music Ministry Director.
